In the December issue of the "Pitcairn Miscellany" there is the result of a Census taken at midnight on December 31st.

Readers might be interested to learn just who is living on Pitcairn. Christian names may serve as a reference for the reader in the future, for it is usual on Pitcairn to use first names only.

Government occupations are shown as for 1979, although all the Pitcairners produce curios, garden and fish, in addition. Pitcairners over the age of 65 receive a government pension of \$14.15 per month. Age groupings in parenthesis, as follow:

In addition to the above, there are 6 non-Pitcairners, the families of the Pastor and Education Officer and one visitor to the island, Robert Quinn. Overall population 61. However, there are also 7 Pitcairners temporarily in New Zealand for medical attention, and if everybody was on the island as at 31st December there would be a population of 68.

As the Miscellany Editor says "readers may find the population distribution by age of interest, as it has some important ramifications for the future of the island:

The distribution is most noteable in Group 5 - only 2 people and both women. The absence of numbers in this group, who are in the prime of life, is sorely felt on the island. However, an encouraging feature is the high number of 9 in Group 4. If these young people can find marriage partners and find a fulfilling life on Pitcairn, the future of the island is assured. But if, like others before them, they choose to leave, the future of the island will be very uncertain".
