



Another sadness caught up with us last week with the very sudden announcement and shock of the death of Enid Chapman, wife of Robbie, of Mission Road.

Enid had only been back on the island for a matter of some 3 weeks, after medical attention in Sydney.

Arriving on Norfolk from New Zealand in 1952, Enid and Robbie were married here in 1955.

A very keen gardener with a great pride in her home Enid was also an artistic craftswoman. Both she and Robbie were keen bowlers and she was a staunch supporter and worker for the bowling club. She also loved a game of Housie and for some time was a Caller at the R.S.L. Housie nights. However, in the last several years she had given up most of her activities to caring for her mother, Mrs. Harker, who is now well on in her eighties.

A meticulously groomed woman - and she kept her car in the same manner - Enid had a great spirit and this was evident in her attitude to a not very encouraging report from the medicos in Sydney. When she visited the printery only a fortnight ago to put in her message of thanks to all who had been so wonderful to her mother during the absence of herself and Robbie, I asked her how she was feeling now that she was home and her answer was 'I think sheer cussedness will carry me through, Tim"-however, that spirit was unavailing in the medical odds against her and it was early last Sunday morning, 9th May, 1982 in the Norfolk Island Hospital that Enid Chapman passed away.
