Another shock to the community was the announcement that "Frankie" Christian had died peacefully at his home in Mill Road, last Saturday morning, 21st October.

He had not been too well over the last few months but we did not expect that sadness so

suddenly.

The eldest son of the late Charles Reuben and Ruth Kilminster (nee Horrocks) Christian, Franklin Consett Reuben Christian, always known as Consett to the family but 'Frankie 'to his many friends, was born on Norfolk in 1924. It was a large family - of 5 girls - Penelope, Pamela (deceased), Esme, Ena and Mera and 4 boys -Consett, (now deceased) Dalyell, Sydney and Fletcher.

After schooling on Norfolk, Consett went to

the Kogarah Technical College.

He joined the RAAF, and under the Canadian Air Training Scheme became a Bomber Pilot, seeing service in New Guinea, and after discharge at Wagga, NSW, came back to Norfolk.

He did some farming but during the whaling years on the island, was the engineer for the Whaling Station until that disbanded in 1960.

Marrying Robyn Gulley, they had three sons -Nicholas, Timothy and Richard. However, Robyn and Frankie decided to part some 10 years ago and she took the boys to the mainland where they have been ever since.

The three boys were able to come over for the funeral which was conducted by the Rev. Les Thompson in All Saints, Kingston and later at the

graveside at Kingston Cemetery.

It was indicative of the charisma of Frankie, always ready to help, always ready to 'pull the leg" that All Saints was packed for the service. There are many on the island who will forever remember

him for his generosity.

During the service, young Richard faced those many people and it must have been quite an effort for him, to thank everyone for their friendship to his father and to himself and his two brothers since they had arrived on the island, apologising for the absence of his mother who had been unable to be present.

The boys told me of the so very happy times they had had with their father in his only recent visits to the mainland. "We had a really good time together, catching up with a lifetime of memories for both Mum and us. He became our best friend and we will treasure those days with him" they

As there was no photo available from any of the family, we could not think of a better tribute to Consett than to publish the one I took of the three boys when they visited me in the Printery on Thursday.....and no better epitaph than to say of 'Frankie' - than "he was a friend to all and it was good to know him" ... and as one who had known him since my first visit in 1949, his cheery greetings never failed to leave a feeling of warmth.

To Penelope, Dalyell, Sydney, Esme, Ena, Fletcher, Mera and the members of their families and the families of Pam and Consett, our heartfelt sympathies in the loss of their dearly loved Consett.


