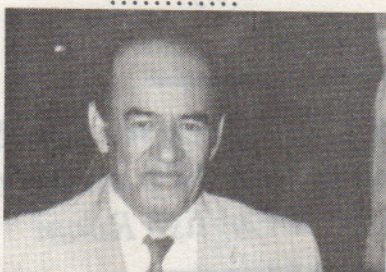

They have two children, Peter and Judy, both living in New Zealand.

The funeral service was last Wednesday at the Mercy Hospital Chapel in Auckland.

Berrys and Ian have a small circle of very good and loyal friends on the island and no doubt they will be very supportive to Ian when he comes back next Tuesday.

In the meantime, to Ian, Peter and Judy, we extend our heartfelt sympathies in the loss of Berrys, who was an inspiration of calm acceptance and courage, particularly in the last few months.

In 1952 Pow enlisted in the Australian Army and was a member of the 3rd Battalion R.A.R. which received an American Presidential citation for action in the Korean War.

After recovering from wounds suffered during the Korean War, Pow was part of the Australian Army contingent which attended the Coronation of Queen Elizabeth II in 1953.

On his return to Norfolk, Pow became a staunch member of the R.S.L. Sub-Branch and the R.S.L. Race Committee.

Like most Norfolkers, Pow enjoyed his sport particularly football in his younger days and later cricket and lawn bowls.

During his working life he was a painter with the Norfolk Island Administration for many years and also a member of the Norfolk Island Police Force.

He spent a few years working in Sydney and during that period worked as a security guard at the Sydney Opera House.

Pow dearly loved his brothers and sisters, his nieces and nephews and their children. A classic example of his soft and generous nature is the following extract from an article about Norfolk Island published in the Sydney "Daily Mirror" in 1971:

"When he had to lock up a young naval rating, he couldn't bring himself to put him in a narrow barred cell, so he took him home. The Norfolk Islanders beat a track to his door with food and drink for the 'locked up' sailor who never had it so good!"

Although suffering noticeably during the last few months of his life, Pow was never one to complain. It was very evident to us all, that he was failing in health, but he always was immaculately dressed even though his steps were getting slower and slower as he walked along the road.

Pow was pre-deceased by brother Ernie and sister Madeline and is survived by brothers Hess, Plute and Richard and sisters Edie, Rose, Sally, Rangi, Lorna and Eileen.

The family is a close one and Pow never lacked for attention.

Pastor Les McPhee conducted the funeral service at Kingston on Friday at 4 pm.

We convey to the brothers and sisters and their families our sincere sympathies in the loss of Pow.

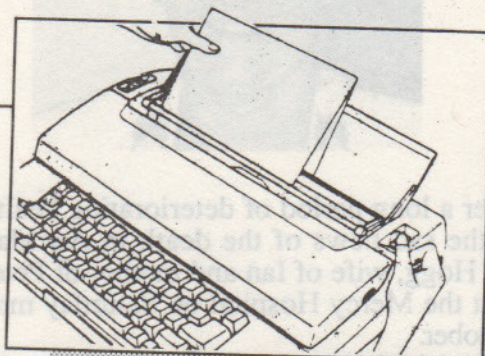
