Last Wednesday, October 1st, Norfolk Island lost one of its most respected citizens - Frederick William Ernest Jowett.

After courageously combatting and living with the knowledge that his life span was at a premium, Freddie (as he was affectionately known on the island) passed away at his home in Red Road, at the age of 64 years.

Freddie and his wife Maurge came to Norfolk In 1963, Freddie having been appointed Communications Engineer for the Department of Science in charge of our Ionospheric Station.

From that time, both Freddie and Maurge became interested and very active in community affairs, especially in the environmental, conservation and ecology fields, doing a great deal of research and work in aiding Jeremy Holloway produce his book on the moths and butterflies of Norfolk Island.

He worked tirelessly to maintain and improve our community radio station on which we have become so dependent. Apart from this radio work, he nursed for many years with tender loving care, the electronic and X-ray equipment at the hospital.

Another of Freddie's community service was

that of Magistrate for many years,

It was in February 1985 that Freddie first underwent surgery and we, who have known him during his years on Norfolk, could not but be uplifted by his fortitude and cheerfulness throughout the ensuing period.

Our thoughts are with Maurge who has had such a sad time during those months of keeping up with Freddie's cheerfulness and hope and we convey to her, her friends and relatives our sincerest

sympathies.
