## VALE

It is with sadness this week that we hear of the death in Brisbane of a man who has served his fellowmen throughout his adult life.

George Weslake, father of Ralph of Norfolk Island, died at his home last Sunday evening, 8th November, passing peacefully away after some months of deteriorating health.

Born in London on 24th April 1898, George Weslake was brought up in Devon and served in the British Army as gun layer in the artillery in France during World War I. He came to Australia in 1922 and married Olive Victoria Ralph the same year. There were 5 children of the marriage - Ralph, Valerie (Mrs. Read), Noreen (Mrs. Knight), David (deceased) and Audr ey (Mrs. Harrington) - the three sisters live as far apart as Tasmania, South Australia and

Pastor Weslake was baptized into the Seventh-day Adventist Church in 1924 by the late Pastor Frank Knight and served his church in the capacities of Head of the Publishing work for the Queensland Conference; transferred to North New Zealand in 1932 serving there as Publishing Secretary - then a period of pastor-evangelism in South New Zealand.

Ordained in Christchurch in 1941 he continued as Pastor in cities in both North and South New Zealand and in 1950 came from New Plymouth to Norfolk Island where he served 5 years in his first term here.

Mrs. Weslake passed away in 1961 in Queensland and in 1962 George married Miss Florence Schmidt and for the next few pastored in areas around Brisbane. He returned to Norfolk Island in 1967 for a period of 2 years.

He and Flo went to England in 1970 and even though now fully retired, George undertook to care for the growing interest at Goondiwindi, which had been started by Adventist Aviation Association, and worked there for a period of 6 months before his health gave out.

When son David, also a Pastor, died in 1980, George's health further deteriorated, an operation and a couple of spells in hospital did not help.

There are many of us on NOrfolk who can remember Pastor George Weslake and his untiring ministry and popularity on the island.

To Flo, to Ralph and Enid and family, to Valerie, Noreen and Audrey and their families, we convey our sincere sympathies in the sad loss of their beloved Pastor George.
