The "HemoCue" is a photometer designed to read Haemoglobin (the oxygen-bearing, iron-containing conjugated protein in vertebrate blood cells, consisting of about 6 per cent haem and 94 per cent globin) according to the cyanmethemoglobin method using either whole blood or hemolysate with a given B-Hb value.

Being portable, the system is ideal for use in the Red Cross Blood Bank operation, providing a degree of independance from Laboratory and for general use, ensuring a quick reading, about 45 seconds, with great accuracy, from the digital display. "HemoCue" uses lost cost microcuvettes which reduce possible contamination to the barest

The cost of this new equipment, about \$700.00, was met by the Norfolk Island Red Cross branch.
