In 1950 the family moved to Borneo where Geoff built and managed an oil refinery with Christopher and Mary-Lou attending school in

Australia.

Later Geoff and Margaret moved to Australia where Geoff started his second career as a Research Scientist, eventually working as an oil

and gas consultant in the Bass Straits.

When they shifted to Norfolk Island Geoff made many visits overseas in his capacity as consultant while Margaret occupied a lot of her time in historical research, writing and publishing two books here on the island. "Punishment Worse than Death" and "The Commandants" while to and froing between Norfolk and Melbourne to teach at her Author's Club.

Grandchildren - Mary-Lou's daughters Serena and Philippa were annual visitors, having their 'second' Christmas always on the island

with Geoff and Margaret.

Geoff and Margaret both loved the island and were reluctant to leave but Margaret's health dictated the move to Melbourne. They left behind many friends. Geoff was a great help to lots of people in his professional capacities and we always found both he and Margaret delightful people to know and enjoy their friendship.

Geoff himself suffered a stroke in 1986, never

really rallying from that.

To Dr.Chris and Veronica, Mary-Lou and her family, we convey our sincere sympathies in the loss of father and grandfather and know that they are comforted in the knowledge that Geoff was able to "come home" to rest.

We were saddened and shocked to hear of the death in Sydney last Tuesday, of Kim Coffey, wife of popular schoolteacher Gerry Coffey.

Kim was only 31 years old and leaves a young

family of Adam and Amy.
