After a period of 3 years in the Norfolk Island Hospital. another of Norfolk's well loved residents. Lilian Beatrice LeCren, passed away on 3rd February

'Doodoo' as she was always referred to, was born on Norfolk Island on 25th January, 1913 one of the two daughters of Blanche and John Snell.

She lived on Norfolk Island for most of her life, at the age of 18 marrying New Zealander Geoff LeCren.

Geoff and Dood built their home in Grassy Road where Geoff operated a small motor garage in front of the property He died in June, 1963

They had a family of four 3 boys and 1 girl the late Ernest John (Toby); Margaret Mary (Prim McCowan). George Edward (Steggles) and Norman Geoffrey (Goof).

As Pastor Keith Jackson, who conducted the funeral service on Monday, said: 'Everyone knew the family by their nickname but it is for sure that anyone hearing these nicknames . unless they knew the family . would not have a clue to whom it referred"

A good mother and a keen bowler. Doodoo was also interested in the work of the R.S.L. and many other community activities. She was a tireless worker for the Scouts when younger son Goof was one of the Editor's Scouts'

Dood won selection to represent Norfolk Island in Ladies Lawn Bowls at the 1979 Fiji South Pacific Games and the Editor will always remember the night that he. together with Dood, Dan Yager and Dolly Dale Christian. were entertained by the Captain and Officers of HMS 'Norfolk' at dinner. Doodoo was a favourite of the dinner party and the Captain's First Lieutenant really made a great fuss of her

On our way back to our lodgings we had to went our way back through the dockyards of Suva, through dark alleys and around 'fraidy corners but all Dood could say was 'Oh dear Darlin, what a lovely evening'

Doodoo also loved her game of football, especially when Goof was running with the Greens - and her cheerful voice could often be heard from the sideline giving encouragement to Goof and the boys in green and more likely than not, going 'crook' at the referee and the other players'

She was made an honorary member of the Greens football team and it was the players of this club who acted as pallbearers at her funeral.

We have enlarged Doodoo's photograph . the original showing the then Administrator Bob Dalkin presenting bowling trophies to an obviously very proud Dood and her youngest son Goof.

Knowing what a vibrant character Dood was before her stroke, the last 3 years must have been a most frustrating time for her. Our very sympathies are extended to all the family and friends.
