FAREWELL 'MUM'.

Our Centenarian Miss Charlotte ("Mum") Bailey, passed away quietly in her sleep at the Norfolk Island Hospital on Thursday evening, 17th April.

It was on 3rd March last that Mum celebrated her 101st Birthday with relatives and friends and at that time she was as hale and hearty as anyone of that age could be - her mind as alert as ever.

We have written of Charl and her life in our paper on three occasions now - when she was our 'Islander of the Week' way back in October 1975; on the occasion of her 100th Birthday on 3rd March 1985 and again on the occasion of her 101st Birthday on 3rd March 1986!

"Mum" has had a great innings - she never married but led a busy life, with music as her main hobby and her talents given freely to the community, until arthritis caught up with her many years ago. She spent quite a time at "The San" at Wairoa, getting treatment. However, for some years now she has been bedridden - much to her disgust, as a very independent person. However, she retained her good humour and agile brain to the last - the spirit was always willing!

In Charlotte Bailey we have lost "one of the old school" - a courteous, kindly, God-fearing Norfolk Islander. While it is a sad occasion for her many relatives to lose their dear "Mum" no one will regret her peaceful passing and she will long be remembered not only as Norfolk's only Centenarian plus one, but as a really "Grand Old Lady of Norfolk Island".

The funeral service was held at All Saints, Kingston, the Rev. Brian Black officiating on Friday afternoon, 18th April, 1986.
