



Norfolk Island Ports Management Strategy


Scope

The Department of Infrastructure, Transport, Cities and Regional Development (Department) has employed the services of Grosvenor Performance Group (GPG) to perform a review of current port management operations on Norfolk Island. The capture of current operations and issues will contribute to the future port management model and strategy to be developed by the Department with the assistance of GPG.

Reliable and safe port operations are essential to the economic wellbeing of the Norfolk Island community. The Australian Government is exploring options for the future management of Norfolk Island ports, including sustainable sea-freight models, land-side infrastructure and operational requirements, and measures to ensure compliance with Biosecurity and First Point of Entry requirements.

Timeline

The project will be conducted across a seven-month timeframe from July 2019 – January 2020. In this time stakeholder engagements will take place both on and off island to inform the current port operations, and important considerations for a new model. The project will conclude with the commencement of a transition to the new, agreed model for port operations.



Stakeholder Engagement Plan

Potential solutions will be explored with a wide range of stakeholders, and seek to leverage the existing expertise and knowledge of the Norfolk Island community in developing and assessing options. This will be achieved using the principles of the Community Engagement Framework ([CEF](#)) that was co-designed with the Department and Norfolk Island community. The CEF identifies a long-term vision of 'Working together respectfully towards a sustainable future for Norfolk Island'. This reflects both the Department and Norfolk Island representatives' investment in the long-term sustainability of Norfolk Island.

The Ports Management Strategy project team will work to bring this vision to life, through meaningful planned engagement activities which will help identify and enact sustainable solutions for the future management of Norfolk Island ports, that recognise the experience, expertise and resourcefulness of the Norfolk Island community.
