

- Mum was mechanic. In most of her life she could fix a chainsaw or mower, but of more recent years, Mum could dabble with cars. Remember the Red Hyundai Getz? So Rinkus would disconnect the horn and the radio Mum would replace the fuse. Rinkus would then hide the fuse Mum would get Cascade Motors to replace the fuses. Rinkus would then visit all mechanics on Norfolk Island leaving instructions not to fix NI 515 radio and horn fuses.
- 11. Mum was a Doctor. Sorry but this trait will take awhile to explain. As children who lived in creeks and the jungle we obviously had shared baths. Mum would scrub the wax out of our ears until it was open to infection then she would apply very hot poulters straight from the oven Talk about learning not to complain about sore ears .
- 12. Continuing as a Doctor. Mum was a medical scientist. You see in August 2017 Mum went to RPA in Sydney to have a pacemaker inserted. That evening after the procedure Mum had a rather serious fainting spell. The Cardiologist and his Registrar and a few Interns turned up, pulled the curtains, stood with clipboards and a worry look? Vonnie can you explain what happened asked the Cardiologist? Vonnie very quickly told all of them she had CRAFT disease. The Cardiologist turned and looked at her Registrar, the Registrar turned to the Interns, the Interns turned and looked into the curtains. Vonnie what do you mean you have CRAFT disease? With a very wry and deliberate smile Vonnie adjusted her posture and lift her head off the pillow and told the ensemble of brains and academics who are remunerated way above what Vonnie could ever imagine and said Can't Remember a Fing thing. I can recall the entire ward including the Nurses Station just giggling and laughing and it was a That's Gold moment.

That's Mum to a Tee. Forever a prankster and always one for fun and music. One thing we do know and that is we had the best teachers of all time in Mum and Dad.

On a more sombre note I would like to mention about her later years with Dementia. A cruel disease and one that is different from patient to patient. Mum was one of laughter and cheek and full of music. The loss of her husband and then the need to retire was seemingly part of aging and moving on. But in December 2020 after a large faint the NIHRACS Doctor took away her driver's licence. This was a huge change in her mental and physical state and not easy to explain. Mum wondered onto the road, she talked locals and tourists into allowing her to jump in the back seat of their cars, instructed them to go for drives, and then the family would get a call from say Taan at Paradise to come and pickup Vonnie. So funny without causing a fuss.

Mum relied on family to rise and shine her in the

morning and then to place her into bed in front of her TV every night. No-one complained about caring for their brainy and beautiful Mum and Grandmother in the later years with Dementia. After 66 years at JE Road Mum peacefully passed away to the singing of You Are My Sunshine and the Ship of Fame by her family in her own bed in her own home with absolutely no pain or suffering. Rest in Peace our beautiful Mum.
